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Display Home Erskine

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Home of a Greek god

With extensive glazing in the main living areas and seamless links to an alfresco area under the main roof, the Olympus display, by Summit Homes, is designed for relaxed and casual family living and to capitalise on a rear view.

Big games and living rooms flank a central dining area across the back of the home, with a raised and raking ceiling extending out from the dining area to the spacious alfresco area.

Angled benches ensure that key work areas in the kitchen are also positioned to take in a rear view and the separate theatre room is also in this wing, completing the family-friendly communal areas.

The four-bedroom, two-bathroom home, on display at Erskine, has almost 230sqm of internal living space, plus the 20sqm alfresco area, double garage and a pavilion-style portico which lends a degree of formality to the contemporary front elevation.

Sales and marketing manager Tim Underwood said the Olympus was suited to families who enjoyed their time at home with loved ones.

"The rear of the home is dedicated to free-form family fun, with the games room, bar, dining area, living room, alfresco area, kitchen and theatre room all within easy reach," Mr Underwood said.

"The kitchen is a high point of this home, with solid Freestyle benchtops and a feature opening to the games room.

"Its angled design balances perfectly with the adjacent home theatre, which has been cleverly zoned off from the other living areas."

The kitchen also includes 900mm Ariston stainless-steel cooking appliances, a deep walk-in pantry with sleek aluminium-framed doors and additional storage space in overhead cabinets.

The raking ceiling adds volume to the dining area and alfresco area, the games room has a built-in bar in one corner, with inset sink, fridge recess, diagonal wine racks and display shelves, and the theatre room has ample space for seating opposite a broad wall for a TV.

All bedrooms are in the front half of the house and zoned to

separate adults and children, with the main suite on one side of the entry and the minor bedrooms in a wing on the opposite side, with the bathroom and laundry.

The main suite has a big sleeping area, fitted walk-in robe with space to use as a dressing room and an ensuite divided from the sleeping area by a frameless frosted glass panel. It has a double shower, double vanity with square basins and a bath below the glass panel.

The minor bedrooms are big enough for toddlers or

teenagers. Bedroom four is positioned for alternative use as a home office or study.

Outside, the Olympus has an attractive combination of rendered walls, contemporary panelled windows, a Colorbond roof, double garage with sectional door and Fremantle Stone cladding for a feature wall on one side of the peaked portico.
